FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Genesis 1:26 *“Then God said, Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion. . .”* New Revised Standard Version NRSV (translated in 1989)

Genesis 1:26 *“And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion. . .”* King James Version (translated in the 1500’s)

I have heard some murmurs in our congregation about the Bible, mainly: “If the words of the Bible change, how can we know if it’s true?” In other words, we have relied on our previous understanding of authority of Scripture and if someone presents a new understanding, how can it truly be authoritative? Good Question!

Well, first, let me remind you that translations are from Biblical scholars (we hope) who are translating the original Hebrew and Greek into whichever language they speak, in our case, English. People who study ancient Hebrew and Greek in the 1500’s translated the words into the English they spoke. In the 1980’s, the New Revised Standard Version translated the words into the English they spoke which is obviously different than the 1500’s. For example, the 1980’s translators have used “humankind” to be clear that both men AND women were being made in the image of God. Yes, the Bible changes from era to era, reader to reader. It has always been true. Even Jesus reinterpreted the Scripture of his day! (which landed him into some major trouble!)

Sadly, there have been so many misinterpretations, often leading to abuses. Some people, especially those who read literally and without studying the background, have actually thought that “men” meant male and are made in the image of God but not women. So, back to the original question: Can we trust that the word really does mean men and women, and not just “men”? Yes, because Hebrew

scholars have discovered that the word “adamah” in Hebrew truly means people, not “man”. It’s not until later in the Scripture that the human becomes male and female, “ish and ishah”. Plus, it doesn’t make sense. Women reflect God’s image.

So, what do we do? How do we trust anything the Bible says? First, we look who translated it and when. Think of it this way: Medical researchers have worked for hundreds of years to find new ways of understanding illness. They then publish their findings in medical journals. Doctors read those medical journals (or attend conferences, etc.) and learn about the findings. Then when the doctor treats a patient, it might differ than it had before. Maybe there’s a new medication or treatment that works better now. It’s the same with the Bible. Biblical scholars have been researching for hundreds of years. Sometimes, they discover something new because they are studying many actual documents from that time period. Ministers read the journals, books or attend a conference and teach and preach it to their people. The newer the information, the more accurate it usually is.

This summer, I’m hoping we can embark on the passages in Scripture that specifically refer to the traditionally marginalized community of the LGBTQ+ community. I ask you to open your hearts and minds to the newest scholarship from trusted resources and consider new ways of thinking of these texts. The specific Scriptures quoted to call this community demeaning and abusive names have been horribly misinterpreted just like for women not being made in the image of God (and many other passages) and/or the justification of slavery. Please do not hesitate to talk to me about your concerns. I hope you will trust me when I say that if you keep your heart and mind open to what the Holy Spirit wants to tell you, the most that will happen is that your heart and mind will grow as you learn to love even more wonderful human beings made in the image of God.

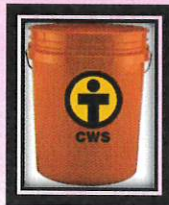

Dear Friends of Habitat for Humanity of Logan County (HFHLC)

Many years ago there was a popular ballad by Peter, Paul & Mary: "If I Had a Hammer ...I'd hammer out love between my brothers and my sisters....all over this land". Today Habitat for Humanity has the hammers - we have a goal and we invite you to come join in our commitment to providing decent housing for families in Logan County.

In 2022 HFHLC will dedicate two homes: #26 a rehab home for a mother with 4 children and #27 a build by LCHS Building and Trades students for a father and his son. That means in 30 years, (August, 1992-2022) decent housing for 20 families in Lincoln - 3 families in Mt. Pulaski - 1 family in Elkhart, 1 family in Atlanta and 1 family in Emden. We celebrate of those 26 families eight have paid their mortgages in full!. There are still families needing decent living conditions willing to Partner with HFHLC in building (or rehabbing) a home for their family.
