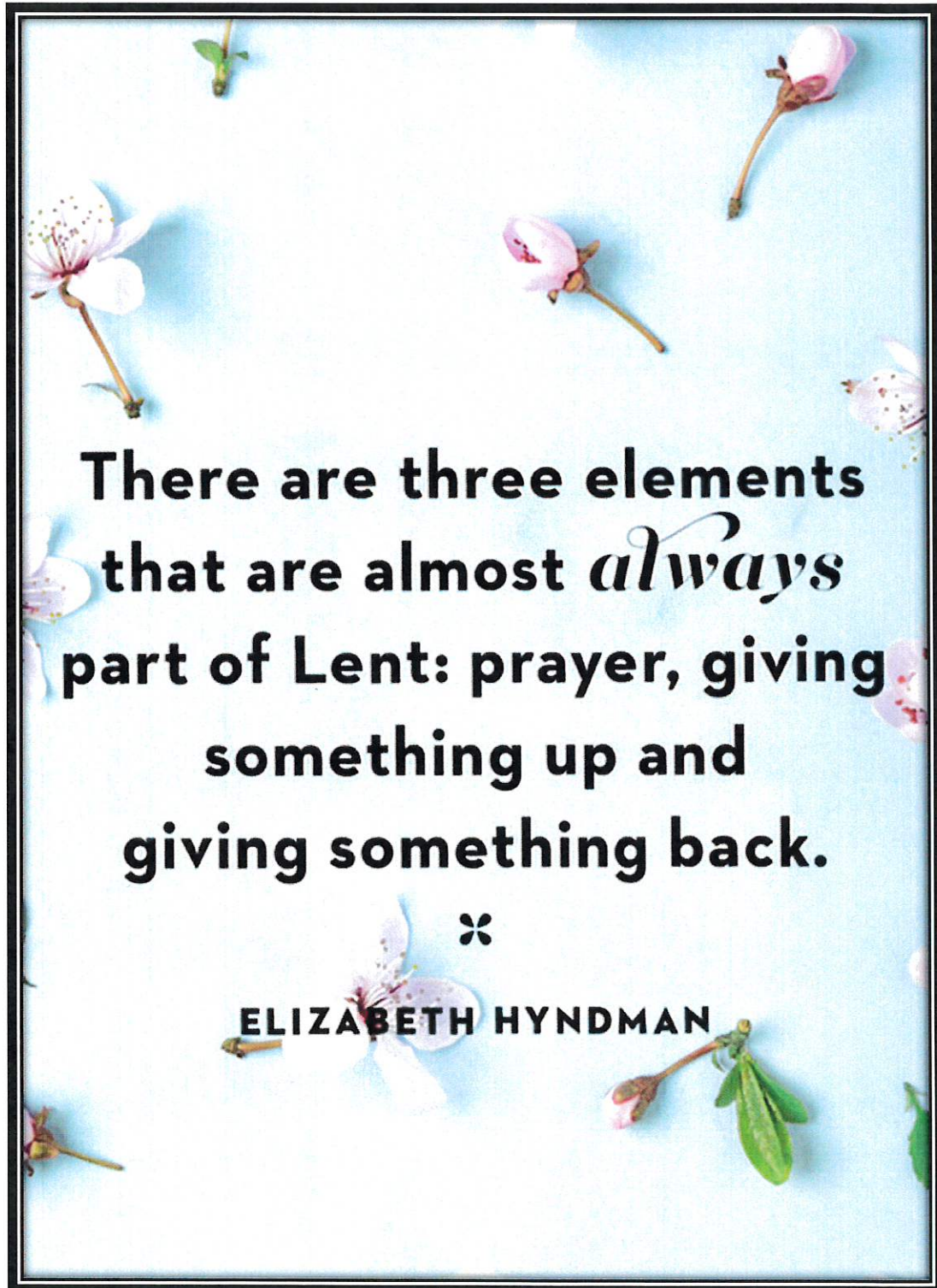

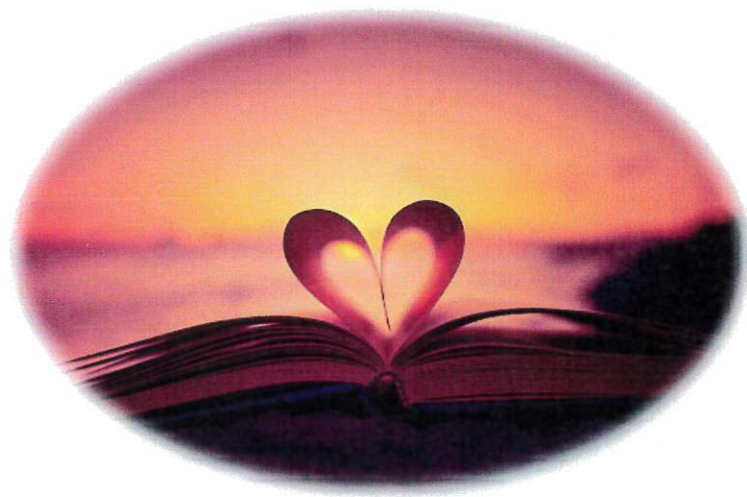

MEETING MINUTES
Monday, February 20, 2023**

President Kent Paulus called the meeting order on Monday, February 20, 2023. Pastor Laurie gave the invocation.

The Lincoln YMCA has approached St. John United Church of Christ to use their facility for their summer camp this summer. Summer camp would be Tuesday, May 30th through Friday, August 11th from 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. There is a maximum of 60 kids. Age range of children is kindergarten through 5th grade with a maximum of 60 children. Last year they had roughly 45. Some field trips are planned. There is a planned cooking camp week with no kitchen access needed. This would also include an after-school program during the regular school year. After school is from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m., or until the last child leaves. Fun days during school year (when school is on break) would be from 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. The typical staff ratio is 1-10 or 1-12 (these are DCFS guidelines). A certificate of insurance will be sent from the YMCA. The church's insurance agent has been contacted. When there is a funeral/visitation at the church; Mr. Froebe (the District 27 Superintendent) has assured the YMCA they can use Central School during emergency situations and scheduling conflicts. Legal counsel will be consulted.

Gary and Leland discussed prices due to rising utility prices. Costs are being discussed. There are some plumbing concerns to be addressed. Fitzpatrick Construction has recently checked different locations of the water system in the

church. There may be some galvanized pipe that can be replaced with copper pipe. (This needs to be addressed whether the YMCA is here or not). Just a side note: do not run the dishwasher until this plumbing issue is resolved.

A motion was made and seconded to take provisional vote to begin to investigate relationship with YMCA. Motion carried.

President Paulus then made a clarification of the consent agenda. A motion was made and seconded to approve the consent agenda. All voting aye. Motion carried.

Pastor Laurie then gave her Pastor's Report. She had a list of furniture that she is willing to leave in the parsonage for the next pastor if needed. It was moved and seconded to accept the furniture. All voting aye. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Kim Webb's Pictures – At the last Church Council meeting the church was given a couple of linen calendars. The calendars were cut off and the pictures were framed. They turned out very nice. They will be displayed in the entryway until a determination of were to hang them is made.

NEW BUSINESS

Pastoral Search – Roger Michalsen stated the Interim Pastor Search committee met and put together a Interim Profile including terms of call and scope of call (provided by Pastor Laurie). A motion was made and seconded to approve the interim profile. All voting aye. Motion carried. Kent and Leland and Pastor Laurie have met with Rev. David Marquardt. They are working on a very part-time contract with him. Rev. Dan Dexter has also offered to help with hospital calls and funerals. Rev. Stephanie Perdew, Associate Conference Minister for Transitional Ministries of Illinois Conference will be part-time starting March 1, 2023 until replaced with a full-time search position.

Pastoral Search Team is being formed. Names were brainstormed and given to President Kent Paulus for review. He will be contacting people per our By-Laws.

A church member has asked permission to park their trailer near the bus barn parking lot. It was moved and seconded to deny based on insurance concerns. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that 2023 Easter Offering be for Earthquake victims in Turkey and Syria. Motion carried.

Boy Scout Eagle Project – There is a Boy Scout in Troop 102 who will be doing his Eagle Scout Project. The plan is to sod removal, grading and new sod laid. Estimated cost is \$2,000. A motion was made and seconded to allow up to \$2,500 from Contingency Funds for this project. Motion carried.

Other – A council member was approached by a church members with some concerns on the American Flag and Christian Flag in the sanctuary and the carpet. Jan Hahn said there could be monies available in the Memorial Fund for the flags. The carpet issue will be brought up at the next church council meeting.

A thank you from the LCT Board (Lincoln Community Theatre) was received. Thank you for all you do for us!

It was moved and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned with everyone reciting The Lord's Prayer.

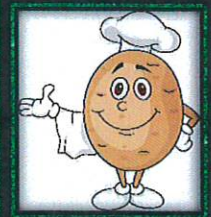
