President Silas Tockey called the meeting to order on Monday, April 21, 2025 at 7:00pm, and he also gave the invocation.

CONSENT AGENDA APPROVAL

A correction was made to the March meeting minutes. Under "Other" #5. Welcome Sign — "like to" was removed. A motion to make correction and accept amended March 17, 2025 Minutes was made and seconded. All voting aye the motion carried. It was moved and seconded to accept the consent agenda as presented. All voting aye, the motion carried.

GUEST DISCUSSION

Chairty Guild – Funeral Dinner Guideline: Toni Reifsteck presented updated guidelines for Funeral Dinners. It was moved and seconded to accept the updated Funeral Dinner Guidelines. All voting aye, the motion carried.

Kitchen Coffee Pot (Bunn) and entryway coffee Keurig machine: Toni wanted to inform the council that the Bunn coffee maker in the kitchen was badly leaking, so it has been replaced. And it has come to the attention of several people that the Keurig machine in the entryway on the coffee cart is producing poor quality coffee due to lack of regular use. Cart will stay. It was moved and seconded to remove the Keurig coffee machine only, from the cart in the entryway. All voting aye, the motion carried.

Silas thanked Toni for attending and bringing her questions to the council.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Building and Grounds Update: Gary Atteberry gave an update on the areas of the church that need addressed or have been addressed.

Sunday School Rooms: A list with each Sunday School room and what is currently in each room was given to the council members. No action was taken.

Dishwasher: A hot water valve was replaced on the dishwasher. So hopefully

no more massive leaks

Outdoor signs fixed: The Outdoor signs were fixed

Custodian: Dana, the custodian is back to work after having her baby.

Landscaping: Thanks to Jack Leich, the landscaping around the church and parsonage has been completed.

Bids for tree removal: Thomas Madigan has submitted a bid to remove two Hackberry trees for \$2000 each and \$1250 for the gumball tree South of the bus barn, which causes leaves in the sunken garden.

Security System: System not functioning properly. The current company, Tech Electronics used the previous company's equipment (Johnson Equipment), so the alarm codes can't be accessed by Tech Electronics. Building and Grounds is assessing options and will present to the Church Council.

Church roof: Some shingles were damaged or came off during the most recent wind storms. Repairs were done, but both the church and the parsonage roofs are in need of replacement. The committee will get bids to present to the council, then the congregation.

YMCA: Due to the stipulation of their grant the YMCA is currently only using the Fellowship Hall and the restrooms.

Silas thanked Gary Atteberry and Leland Semple for presenting the Building and Grounds Report.

- 2. Confirmation: No Discussion
- Hoefer Memorial Tree replacement: Will consult Pastor David Marquardt to get a specific tree and get it planted.
- 4. Pridefest: Saturday, June 7 from 3pm 8pm. A sign-up sheet for volunteers to work at the booth was passed around for council, and it will then be placed on the table in back of the sanctuary for other volunteers to participate. Since St. John UCC is O and A we must be willing and able to participate in events such as Pridefest.
- 5. Monthly Community Organization presenters: We are asking to have a brief 5-minute presentation by local organization representatives for each month, so April 27 with be Jeanette Davis from ROSC (Recovery Oriented Systems of Care). Will be contacting Patti Schonauer from Hope on 5th for June.

NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Church's 165th Anniversary: It was decided to have the Worship Team meet and decide how to celebrate this anniversary.
- 2. Birthday Observance during Worship service: It was moved and seconded to discontinue the Birthday observance on the 3rd Sunday of each month. All voting aye the motion carried. Will discuss again if any feedback is given.
- 3. Use of index cards for prayer/joys during worship: After discussion it was decided we not use index cards, until a settled pastor comes, then Pastor can make the decision.
- **4. Banners:** Discussed different location for storage of banners, so as not to fade them.
- 5. Special Events: Special Events Committee will have a Graduate Recognition event on Sunday, May 18th. There will be NO 4th of July event this year.
- 6. Communion to Shut-ins: After checking with Western Association Conference Minister, Kathy Lawes, about lay people serving communion to shut-ins, or homebound, she said that communion should be served by Elders, but lay people may accompany.

There was no correspondence or e-mails.

It was moved and seconded to adjourn the meeting. All voting aye, the motion carried. All said the Lord's Prayer as the benediction before adjourning at 8:45pm.
