President Silas Tockey called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, May 19, 2025, and he also gave the invocation.

CONSENT AGENDA APPROVAL

It was moved and seconded to approve the consent agenda as submitted. All voting aye the motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT – Pulpit Supply Schedule for the upcoming Sunday services – May 25, Dr. Rev. Ken Kline; June 1, Rev. Jim Christian; June 8 (Pentecost) Rev. Chris Schilling; June 15, Ann Lamkey; June 22, Rev. Chris Schilling; June 29, Silas Tockey; July 6, Rev. Chris Schilling

OLD BUSINESS

- A. Confirmation** – Still on hold
- B. Hoefer Memorial Tree** – A non-bearing (gumballs) sweet gum tree has been purchased to replace the removed tree. It will not produce the gum balls, but berries that the birds will eat. It will be bright red in the fall. Cost was not quite \$250.00.
- C. Pastoral Supply** – See the Pastor's Report
- D. Pridefest**- June 7th from 3pm – 8pm – There are still open times that need covered in our booth.

- E. 165th Church Anniversary** – Laura Lee submitted the minutes from the Worship Team meeting on May 8th. The team decided that a one-day celebration would be scheduled for the event. That date would be Sunday, October 26th, 2025. Lincoln Land Catering was contacted and is available on October 26th.

It was decided to take the meetings decisions and information to the council before making any other plans. Laura did ask the council about the possibility of the council (church) paying for the meal cost for the guests and possibly a percentage of the entire cost, thus making the individual cost a bit lower. The Council would like to see the cost at the next council meeting.

- F. Sanctuary Roof Replacement** – Gary Atteberry gave a presentation of what is specifically needed for a new roof replacement for the sanctuary. Other roof areas of the church have been replaced recently. Two bids were submitted. One from Kreiling from Peoria, which is the company that has been doing recent repairs, and the other bid was from Sundown from Bloomington. The bids were not comparable at first, so Gary asked them to give a second bid with more comparable items. Kreiling's bid was \$88,788.00 and Sundown's bid was for \$101,000.00. Gary gave many details.

Bob Meinershagen said that the cost could be reached using funds in the Special Funds account.

It was moved and seconded to present the bid from Kreiling Roofing of Peoria for \$88,788.00 to the congregation for approval at a congregational meeting on Sunday, June 8th. All voting aye, the motion carried.

A Special Congregational Meeting will take place on Sunday, June 8th following the service. The meeting will be announced at church service on May 25th and June 1st. A mailing will also be sent out. Silas thanked Gary for taking the time to researched and meet with bidders, and give his presentation to the council.

- G. Alley Door Welcome Sign** – Roger Michalsen has asked if we would like to have a “Welcome to St. John UCC” sign painted on the metal door in the Fellowship Hall that goes out to the alley. The YMCA uses that door and is using Fellowship Hall this summer for their YMCA Summer Camp. It was moved and seconded to accept Roger’s offer to paint a Welcome Sign on the alley door. All voting aye, the motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

- A. Communion Schedule for the summer was completed.
- B. Laura Lee will be gone for two Sundays – July 20th and July 27th. A substitute has already been contacted.
- C. Silas Tockey will be on vacation from June 14th – 21st, so requesting the next council meeting be on Monday, June 23rd, a week later than usual. It was agreed to move next month’s meeting.
- D. **Hope on 5th** – Patti Schonauer will be here on Sunday, June 8th to give a brief explanation about the importance of Hope on 5th to the community. We are trying to have a guest come and give a brief description of different groups/organizations each month.

CORRESPONDENCE AND EMAILS

Associate Conference minister, Rev. Kathy Lawes was contacted about coming to preach sometime this summer. She will be asked about June 8th or July 13th. She is serving the Eastern, Prairie, and Western Associations.

ADJOURNMENT

It was moved and seconded to adjourn. All voting aye the motion carried. All said the Lord’s Prayer before adjourning.

At St. John we celebrate Earth Day not just on April 22 but every day - right here under The Giving Tree. Stop by and take a look at all of the ways you can help to protect God's Earth and God's people.

As a reminder:

Caps and Lids - Plastic caps and lids are made into benches and other items useful to the community. These caps may include those from containers such as milk, juice and detergent bottles. Lids come from containers such as cottage cheese and margarine.

Pop tabs - The tabs are taken to Ronald McDonald house in Springfield where they help to provide housing for families of children who are hospitalized or in treatment in Springfield and Peoria.

Aluminum cans - The money raised from the can collection is given to the Logan County Humane Society.

Athletic shoes - Used and worn-out athletic shoes are taken to Nike outlets. They are ground up and used for playground and court surfaces.

Printer cartridges - Used ink cartridges support and are recycled by the Hartsburg Emden school district.

Eyeglasses - These are given to the Lion's Club for their eye glass projects.

Cell phones - The phones will be given to shelters for use as emergency phones.

Rechargeable batteries - Our only goal here is to keep these things out of the landfill!

Bingo prizes - St. Clara's is always looking for prizes that the people in the nursing home will enjoy.

Plastic grocery bags - These are given to the Humane Society.

Kleenex and wipes - All of the schools need lots of these.






