

FROM OUR PASTOR

Grace and peace,

On my heart this week is Holy Week, which we are just about to enter as I pen these words. Now ask any member of the clergy what bothers them most about Easter, and truthfully Christmas as well, are the crowds that normally fill our churches for these wonderful religious holidays. Christians so look forward to this time in worship as families gather to share the birth and resurrection of our Lord and Savior. But what about the other Sundays?

You see as I'm preparing bulletins, messages, and such for Holy Week, it must be said that Holy isn't just a week. Holy isn't just Christmas and Easter. Holy is a way of being. It is a way of life. And it is how we honor our God who sent Jesus to us on Christmas, and raised him from the grave on Easter. Holy is!

Now I could write about this for pages and pages, but my reading brought before me an author who said what was on my mind.

Yolanda Pierce writes, and portions shared:

I often attend church when I would rather be somewhere else. There are Sundays when the weather seems too perfect to be inside, when I'd rather sit outdoors at my local pancake house and read the paper. There are Sundays when my mind is racing or there are too many things on my to-do list....

I show up because God always meets me when I am faithful. God always shows up. Sometimes God shows up in the parking lot, in the person who greets me with a firm handshake or a hug. Sometimes God shows up in laughter over bagels during coffee hour. Sometimes God shows up in the face of the impossibly cute toddler who wants to play peekaboo with me all

service long. I show up and God shows up, and not necessarily in the sermon. I often encounter the holy presence of God before the pastor has spoken a single word.

Our churches are far too pastor-centric. We are so busy expecting the word of God to come from the pastor that we miss how God's presence arrives in other forms. Sometimes the word shows up in the person sitting next to you who hands you a peppermint. Sometimes the word comes from seeing the person who was in the hospital last month, now sitting in the pew in front of you. Sometimes the word comes from the audacious hat that one of the church mothers is wearing. God's powerful presence is all around us, not just streaming from the words spoken in the pulpit.

One Sunday, God showed up in the comments of a woman whose name I didn't even know. A creature of habit, I often sit in the same pew, as do many others in my church. I had seen her many times before; we had shared a hug and passed the peace on multiple occasions. As I arrived at my familiar pew after a few Sundays of being on the road for work, this woman leans over to me and says, "I missed your smile for the past few weeks. I want you to know I'm praying for you and miss you when you're gone." Tears welled in my eyes. The service hadn't started. The praise and worship team hadn't sung a single note, nor had the pastor even arrived at the pulpit. But surely God was present in that moment of deep human connection. She saw me, and she reminded me that God sees me.

But not every Sunday brings some new insight or revelation. Not every Sunday brings some transformative change into my life. Not every Sunday soothes my doubts and calms my fears. Yet every single Sunday brings me joy. There is joy in the simple pleasure of being present among the people of God, showing up week after week. This is why the writer of Hebrews reminds us that we should not neglect to meet together, to assemble together and thereby encourage one another (10:24–25). And while I love that there is so much we can do as a community via all the remote tools we now have, nothing can ever replicate the beauty of being with one another in the flesh, fully present.

We invite God's divine presence to show up where there is war, division, and despair and to bring peace. We invite God's divine presence to show up where there is pain and confusion and to bring comfort. We invite God's divine presence to show up where there is exhaustion, so we rest in the certainty that when our strength is not enough, God's grace is always sufficient. And we can try to show up for each other with the same consistency and faithfulness with which God shows up for us.

Please don't ever get me wrong! I love seeing you, even if it's just for C&E. And while I and others miss you the other weeks, it's what you're missing that most breaks my heart. It's you missing out on the hugs, the conversations, the smiles, and hellos. It's you missing out on singing your favorite hymn and hearing of the joys and prayer concerns of others, and sharing your own.

Again, please don't ever think this is judgmental, that's not my role. My role is to make every effort to share the immense love that showers down upon us as we share the Word of our God. My role is to help us hear God's still small voice, whether

from the pulpit, the hymns, our readings, or the person who greets us with a smile. Our role together, is to be the church we're called to be, which is more complete, when together happens.

There's no easy way to end what's on my mind, and I'm thankful for Yolanda's words above. My prayer for each of us remains the same, that we can each grow closer to our God, as we think about the immense love and sacrifices, He has made for us, through Jesus Christ His Son.

HISTORICLAL EVENT 50 Year ANNIVERSARY REMODEL – ST. JOHN UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

50 years/remodeling of sanctuary

In January of 1974 at the congregational meeting — the congregation voted to use the model presented as their pattern for remodeling the sanctuary of St. John United Church of Christ. The model was a cardboard 3-dimensional display - the work of several members who worked into the wee early hours of that Sunday morning in the parsonage of the church as a way to better explain what the committee's vision was.

On Easter Sunday, April 14, 1974 the new council robes were dedicated. The last Confirmation Class who took their vows the Sunday before on Palm Sunday, at the old altar, took their first communion on Easter: Gary W. Conrady, Terry L. Denney, Terri L. Gockel, Amy B. McCann, Diane K. Opperman, Randall C. Paulus and Kathy M. Wilham.

Following worship, the Council joined the recessional carrying the altar cross, Bible and other articles for worship. This was the last Sunday of worship in the sanctuary until the remodeling was finished.

On Monday morning following Easter several men of the congregation joined in helping remove the pews, lectern and pulpit to be taken to Blue Mound for refurbishing by Bekenmar Church Furniture Company. In the following months worship and some weddings were held in Fellowship Hall, funerals were held at the funeral homes or a few were held in churches in community (as were some weddings).

On Saturday morning of November 16^{th,} a young bride came to St. John to put decorations, candles and bows in sanctuary for her wedding that afternoon! Tears flowed......they had promised that the work would be done by her wedding day – and lying on the floor of the center aisle was the

Reredos! At that point workers vowed it would be done by noon And it would be cleaned and polished as well.

At noon several women of the church helped the bride and her mother decorate and place the flowers at the altar. Later that afternoon Barbara Heinzel and Mark Hopwood were married – the first to marry at St. John UCC with a center aisle instead of 2 inner aisles and 2 outside aisles. (Throughout the years a few brides had chosen other churches for their wedding because of the aisle arrangement)

The following day, Sunday, November 17, 1974 worship returned to being held in the sanctuary. Special interest were the new 'beams' across the ceiling of the sanctuary. Although they look like 'wood' they are actually a plaster created to look like wood and painted as such. The lights hanging in the sanctuary were left in their original place



now hanging above the pews instead of over the 2 aisles of old plan. The new chancel featured the organ (moved from the sanctuary floor), 2 choir lofts, lectern and the pulpit brought down to the main chancel floor level instead of elevated center. Most were happy with changes cushions on pews were optional there if you wanted them - some were left bare for those who did not want cushions – Wood from the old chancel steps was used by a member to make the Grandfather Clock that stands in Wilmert Lounge. Clock works came from Germany.

Ironically the calendar dates are the same in 2024 as 1974–50 years later except April 14 is not Easter this year. November 16 will fall on a Saturday/the date of completion – November 17 will be on a Sunday.


MISSION COMMITTEE
