FROM OUR PASTOR

Some of you know, but for those who haven't heard, I have advised the Church Council that I plan to finish my ministry with St. John over the next 90 to 120 days. At that time we will have worshiped together for 17-18 months when it was my intent to only 'bridge' the gap until an interim was found. It wasn't easy making this decision, but I feel very strongly that it's the right call.

St. John has elected and installed a wonderful group who is working diligently as your Search Committee. I have had a couple of occasions to be with them, and it's a joy to see how hard they're working and how serious they are at answering the churches call. They have recently completed an update to the Church Profile, the Church Council approved it, and it is now posted at the top of the UCC profile page. Please be in prayer for this dedicated group and for the Lord to send just the right person to pastor St. John into the future.

Our family is grateful for the kindness we've been shown, and if distance wasn't an issue, then we'd most likely stay for a while longer. I'd be remiss not to mention how much we'll miss everyone once God calls us away. We feel like this is our 'home church' and it will be difficult to say goodbye. But let us not forget, that God is in control and has plans for St. John moving forward. Somewhere there's the right person who will walk into the sanctuary, love you, worship with you, and be present with you. I am excited for St. John and am anxious to see what God has planned.

So for now we'll worship together and pray together. We'll hold your Search Committee in prayer, and pray for God's Holy Spirit to work in the life of that special someone who will answer God's call.
